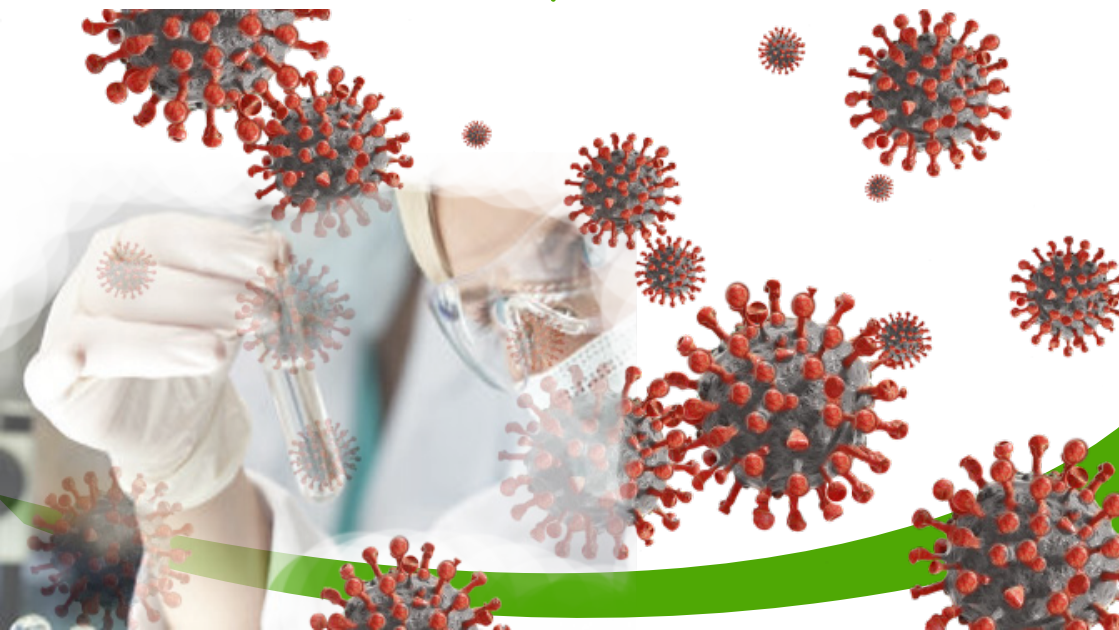




**“COVID19-: ALGERIAN SCIENCE,
